POLICY FOR THE CURRICULUM

All pupils at Grosvenor School, of compulsory school age, receive full-time supervised education. This gives pupils experience in linguistic (including French and German), mathematical, scientific, technological, human, social, moral and spiritual, (through Assemblies, Church Services, PSHE and RE lessons), physical, aesthetic and creative education.

- The subject matter taught is appropriate for the ages and aptitudes of the pupils, including those pupils with a Statement.
- The requirements of any Statemented pupils are met.
- The pupils are able to acquire skills in speaking and listening, literacy and numeracy through the broad curriculum offered and the many extra-curricular clubs and activities.
- The principal language of instruction is English but support is provided, as appropriate, for pupils for whom English is not their first language particularly through the Modern Foreign Languages department. The personal, social and health education taught throughout the school reflects the School's aims and ethos.
- PSHE is taught discretely in other subjects areas such as healthy eating and care of the body in Science.
- The pupils are given appropriate careers guidance through discussion with staff and in Citizenship lessons.
- All pupils are given the opportunity to learn and make progress.
- Grosvenor School provides the opportunity for responsibility as well as experiences of adult life through the Curriculum, Assemblies, visits and visitors from outside agencies.
- There is a range of extra-curricular activities organised by the School at lunch time, after school, weekends and in the holidays to enrich the experience of the pupils.
